

Accessible:

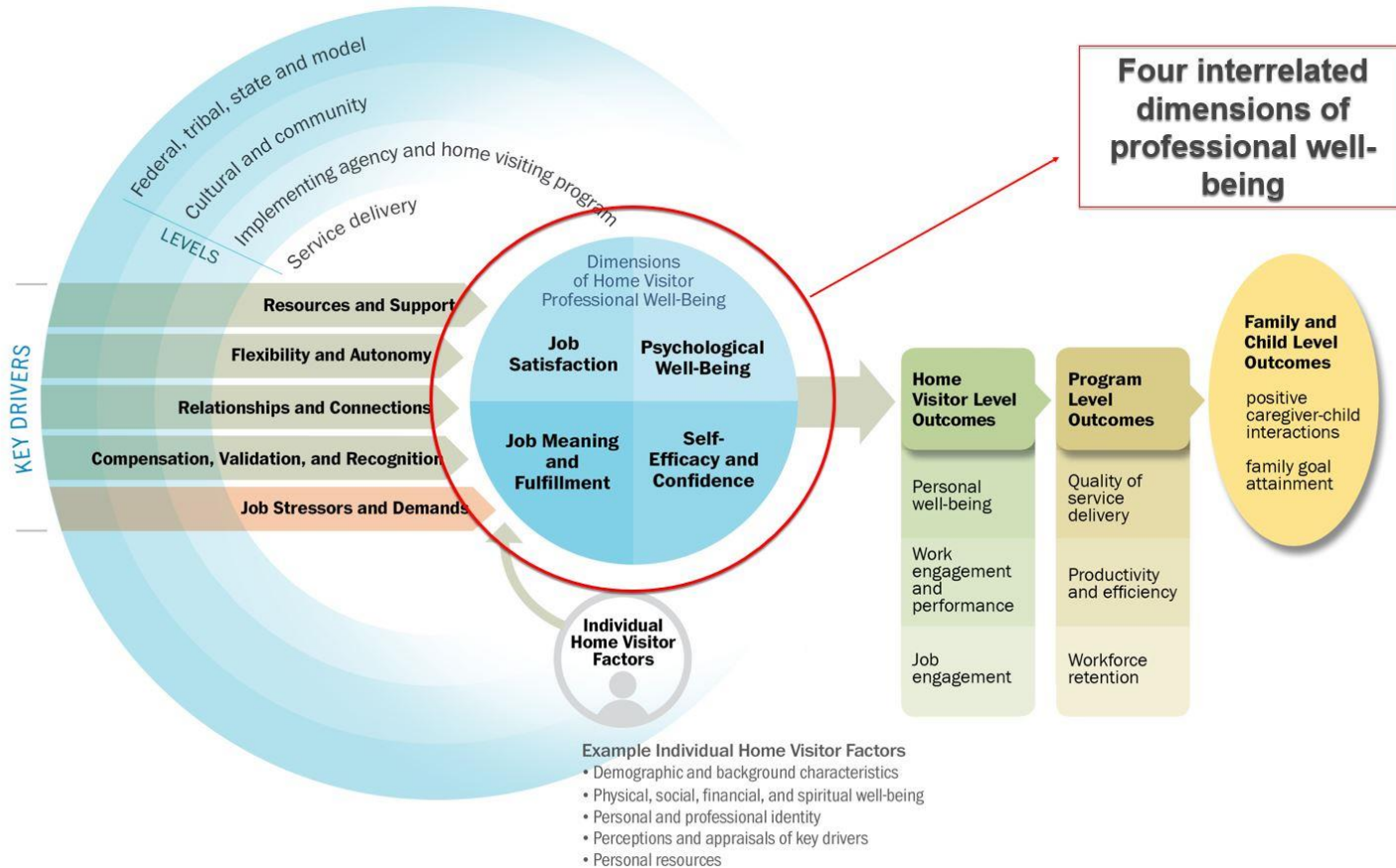
What is professional well-being?

The Supporting and Strengthening the Home Visiting Workforce (SAS-HV) project focused on **professional** well-being, specifically:

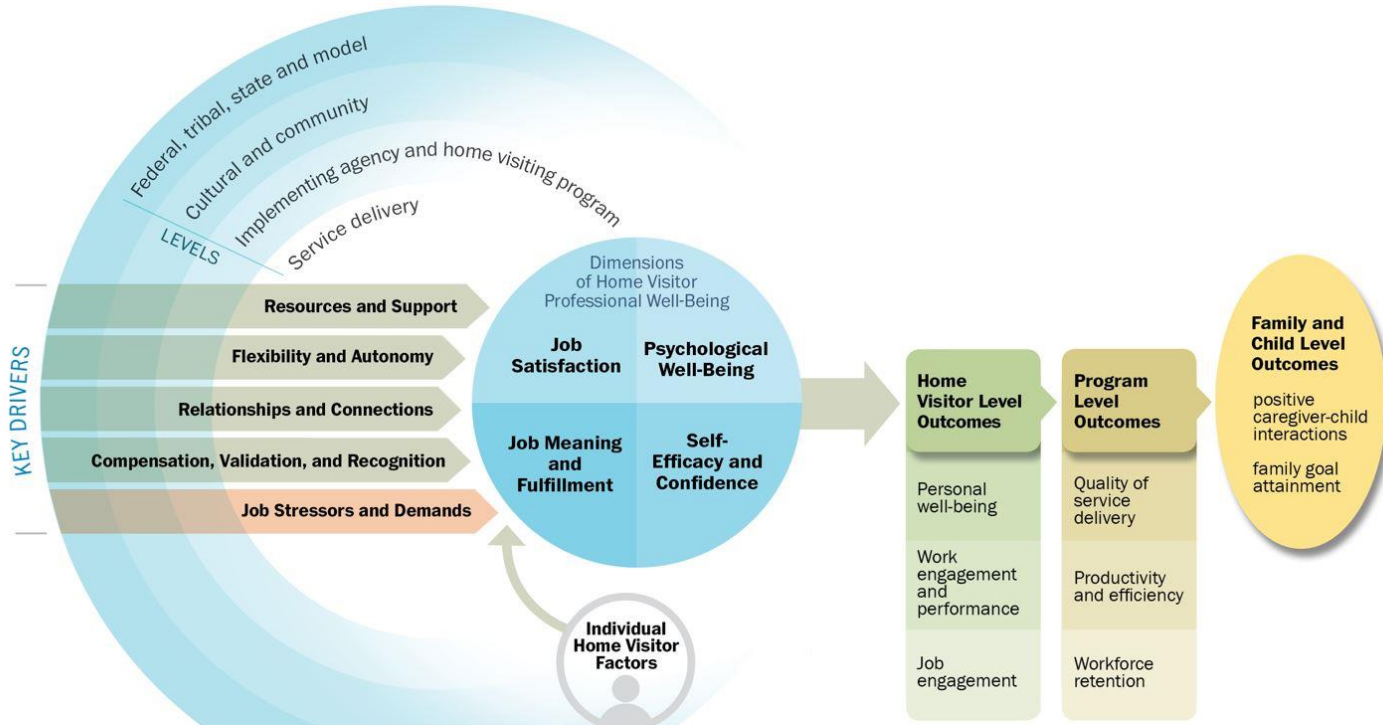
- Workplace experiences unique to home visiting
